Dear Parents

I know and understand that the current situation is unprecedented, however, I would like to stress that as a school we have the best interests of your children at heart. We are regularly receiving updates regarding the situation and the action required of us. As the situation evolves, we are continually reviewing our practices and acting on the advice. We are also continuing to put in place structures that maximise social distancing. Each year level now has a designated eating area and we are reinforcing with the children where they are permitted to play.

We are also reinforcing with the children, the following practices that minimise the spread and we would encourage you to do the same at home.

How to minimize the spread of COVID-19


- ◆ Frequently washing your hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and water, or using an alcohol based hand gel
- ◆ Refraining from touching mouth and nose
- ◆ If coughing or sneezing, covering your nose and mouth with a paper tissue or flexed elbow
- ◆ Dispose of the tissue immediately after use and perform hand hygiene
- ◆ Avoiding close contact with anyone if you, or they have a cold or flu-like symptoms (maintain a distance of at least 1 metre).

While we are having to continually make changes and cancel events, we do want the children to continue to feel safe and supported at school, as well as enjoy learning. Our staff will continue to work towards this and your support would be greatly appreciated.






